About the project

KMU.DIGITAL & GREEN is the flagship funding programme of the Federal Ministry of Labour and Economic Affairs (BMAW) in cooperation with the Austrian Federal Economic Chamber (WKÖ).

Since 2017, this initiative supports small and mediumsized enterprises (SMEs) in designing and implementing digitalization and green transformation projects and bringing them to market. Its mission is to **enhance the competitiveness** of SMEs and provide **important impetus for growth and employment in Austria as a business location.**

Due to the high number of applications, the programme has been relaunched in 2024 with the aim to **introduce**SMEs to digitalization as broadly as possible and to support them in their digital and green transformation.



INNOVATION

The programme funds the **combination of green** and **digital transformation** efforts and separates between planning and implementation funding.



SUSTAINABILITY

The programme funds projects aiming at **both the digital and green transition.** It has a strong sustainability dimension and clearly focused on competitiveness in the future.



SCALABILITY & REPLICABILITY

Even though the program is not endlessly scalable because of rather small sums, it is still replicable – specifically as an example for tackling the twin transition for SMEs.



















Activities

The programme has a clear separation between two funding types/modules:

1. Consultancy funding:





2. Implementation funding:

The total funding for a combination of several consultancy tools in the SME sector KMU.DIGITAL & GREEN is a **maximum of 3,000 €** per company, funded and implemented via the Austrian Federal Economic Chamber, WKÖ.

The implementation of new investments in digitalization and sustainability projects is **subsidised with 30% of the eligible costs** and a **maximum of 6,000 €** per company, funded via Austria Wirtschaftsservice GmbH, AWS.

The programme has been evaluated in 2024. The evaluation team concludes that KMU.DIGITAL & GREEN is an **important**, **independent and well-received instrument** with a clear funding concept within Austria's support landscape.

The funding objective of providing universally accessible support for the digital transformation of smaller enterprises with a low level of digital maturity still holds considerable relevance for the Austrian economy. The combination of the two modules of consulting and implementation offers ideal conceptual prerequisites. Across all scales and sectors, SMEs are using the funding as an impetus to implement digitalisation projects. By raising awareness and providing targeted support in strategic planning, KMU.DIGITAL & GREEN helps to remove existing constraints and enables SMEs a demand-driven adaptation to digitalisation



















Impact
